2007- Christian Stewardship- (Phase 2) Dr. Minnie Hinton

This course will cover the basic tenets of Christian Stewardship-time, talent, and tithe. Students will learn how to effectively manage their resources through a better understanding of the spiritual principles, practices, and contributions

2015 Foundations of Christian Ethics (Phase 4) Rev. Harold Butler

Focus on understanding the philosophical and Christological approach to Christian Ethics. Engage in biblical principles for decision making and conduct for living.

2071 Christian Character and how it Develops Dr. Brenda Elliott Lee

Concentrate on the components of Christian Character. Identify methods for the growth of Christian character. Case studies will be used to apply biblical principles to contemporary social, economic, and political issues.

9008 Public Speaking (Elective) Sis. Daereonni Ragland

Identify the process and principles for writing speeches and delivering them in public. Relay basic verbal and nonverbal communications skills that will enable the students to effectively communicate with audiences of all sizes. **(Needed if you apply to be an instructor.**

1044 Isaiah Rev. Charles Brown

Study of the first thirty nine- chapters of the book of Isaiah. Review the works of Uzziah, Jotham, and Ahaz, and the reign of Hezekiah. This period reflects the role of Israel's enemy Assyria, and presents the Lord as mighty Ruler and King.

1089 The book of Romans (Phase 3) Rev. Darian Jones

Engage in an overview of major presented in Paul's doctrinal letter to the Romans Christians. Students will come to recognize each doctrinal truth presented in the book.

2007- Christian Stewardship- (Phase 2) Sis. Ramona Wooten

This course will cover the basic tenets of Christian Stewardship-time, talent, and tithe. Students will learn how to effectively manage their resources through a better understanding of the spiritual principles, practices, and contributions of Christian stewardship.

2011 Baptist Doctrine (Phase 2) Rev. Lee Hardin

Examine with simplicity and clarity the basic teaching of the Baptist Faith. Explore each doctrinal position and basis for each doctrinal in the class.

2061 Millennials in Ministry Young Adults (ages 21- 35) Bro. Rapheal Rogers

Determine the learning styles of young adults pupils. Learn how to set goals for that age group and to identify the materials that are best suited for their learning styles.

4012 Doctrine of the Holy Spirit (Phase 3) Rev. O. K. Patterson

Study the person and work of the Holy Spirit. A thorough look at the corresponding doctrines. That influence our understanding of the work of the Holy Spirit. Identify this doctrine of the church with holistic understanding of salvation, with special emphases justification, redemption, and sanctification.

6008 Church Secretary / Clerk (Elective) Workshop Sis. Karen Harvey

Provide a general overview of the work of the church clerk. Areas covered will include basic function of the clerk, the importance of professionalism and ethics, and responsibilities for the role and presentation to the church and pastor.

6013 Organizing the Church for Christian Education (Phase 4)

Focus on the various administrative and organizational skills needed to organize the Christian Education department. Emphasis placed on structure, leadership, and staffing needs for Christian education.

6021 Spiritual Formation (Phase 1) Rev. Linden Bowie

Enable people to mature in their Christian walks. Focus on a creative and dynamic approach to nurturing people from children to mature adults – to become better disciples of Jesus Christ. Deliberate on what it means to be Christians.

7006 Fundamentals and Strategies for Street Witnessing Rev. Ronald Bobo

Emphasize evangelism in the community. Provide hands-on instruction about the most effective ways to witness to nonbelievers. Focus on recruiting, organizing, and preparing members for street witnessing.

7010 Introduction to Discipleship (Phase 3) Rev. William Gwynn

Introduce the believer to the biblical principles of discipleship. Examine the character traits of believers, while looking at the overall examples of Jesus. Study discipleship methods of Jesus and the difference between discipleship and membership.

8017 The Ministry of Church Ushering (Workshop) Sis. Barbara Peoples

Teach the ministry of ushering in the church. Learn the basic signs, positions, and post locations commonly used in ushering within the church. Needs of the ministry, which are appropriate for local church ministry, will be addressed.

8026 The Church's Ministry to Jails and Prisons Rev. Burton Barr

Teach students methods and procedures for the development of a prison ministry program within the church or community. Receive instructions concerning the protocols for entering jails and prisons, and the importance of working within the jail or prison structure to provide the most effective ministry to the inmates.

8035 The African American Church and Social Justice (Phase 4)

Investigate the lives, theology, and methods of the great servants of God who dedicated their lives in the struggle for liberation of people. Discuss the role of the African-American church in the struggle for the liberation of people. **Instructor Dr. Carlton Caldwell**

8066 Christianity and Contemporary Issues (Phase 4)

Challenge the students to identify and confront contemporary issues. Look at the issues that affect the church, home and community. Think through practical solutions and approaches to immediate and emerging social ecclesiological concerns. **Dr. Jimmy Brown**

9005 Writing Techniques II (Phase 3) Dr. Claudia Fowler

Emphasis will be placed the writing of documented research and the development of other skills necessary to complete the writing assignments in this phase. Help introduce the students to the library and the use of reference material.
